1. Generic

OPTION CLAUSE: The buyer can increase or decrease the contract quantity or contract duration up to 25 percent at the time of issue of the contract. However, once the contract is issued, contract quantity or contract duration can only be increased up to 25 percent. Bidders are bound to accept the revised quantity or duration

PRE-QUALIFICATION CRITERIA (PQC)/ ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The followings are the Eligibility criteria for this Non-divisible Works Contract. The bidder may visit the proposed work site to get well acquaint about the site work before filling the rate/ submit the tender.

1. PAST PERFORMANCE AND PROJECT / PAST EXPERIENCE etc. CRITERIA:

The bidder shall have successfully completed similar work during last 7 years ending on last day of previous month to the one in which tender is invited as per any one of following:

- One (1) similar completed works costing not less than the amount equal to 80% (Rs.30.83 Lakh) of

the estimated cost or

- b. Two (2) similar completed works costing not less than the amount equal to 50% (Rs.19.27 Lakh) of the estimated cost or
- c. Three (3) similar completed works costing not less than the amount equal to 40% (Rs.15.41 Lakh) of the estimated cost.

“Similar work means the bidder must have working experience in carrying out Job of supply/ dismantling/ erection/ rubber lining/ fabrication of tanks/ vessels/ thickeners/ mechanical equipment in any processing plant and BOQ of any one of such work order shall contain rubber lining job also.

2. FINANCIAL STANDING:

The average annual financial turnover during the last three (03) years, ending 31st March of the previous financial year, i.e. 2021 - 2022, 2022 - 2023 and 2023 - 2024 should be at least 30% (Rs. 11.56 Lakh) of the estimated cost

3. EPF registration copy, GSTIN copy, PAN copy must be submitted along with the bid.
4. Any bid not complying PQC requirements shall be summarily rejected.

Documentary evidence in the form of works order copies along with completion certificate specifying the work and amount of contract should be uploaded. Bidders have to upload documentary proof of PAN, GST registration no., turnover of last three financial year, EPF A/C. No. and ITR/Annual report etc.

The eligibility is to be decided strictly based on documents submitted at the time of receipt of tenders. No additional documents are to be allowed to be submitted after receipt of tenders but there is no bar to seek clarification or authentication of submitted documents. However in case of poor response, with a view to increase the competition, admission of additional documents to meet the PQC may be allowed subject to the condition that

- a) **Poor Response’ implies when less than three bids are found suitable on the basis of submitted eligible documents as per NIT.**
- b) **The additional document should not be issued subsequent to last date of receipt of tender as mentioned in the NIT.**
- c) **The bidder submitting additional documents has submitted EMD and tender cost as prescribed in NIT.**

The opportunity of submission of additional documents will be given to all the bidders.

NOTE:

If the works are provided by the contractor in accordance with this contract, Corporation will pay the contractor the price (awarded value); and reimburse the contractor for the approved expenses (as specified in the order/ contract), after the approved expenses have been incurred by the contractor. Corporation will not be liable to reimburse the contractor for expenses other than approved expenses, unless Corporation’s prior approved written consent.

The UCIL shall pay on reimbursement basis to the total applicable GST @ prevailing rate as per GST rule on total transaction value (i.e. price actually paid to the service provider) after deduction of GST amount from the amount mentioned in the contract rate. GST on penalty, interest, non-related expenses and applicable GST on forfeiture of SD/ retention money/ EMD etc. shall not payable.

3. Buyer Added Bid Specific Scope Of Work(SOW)

Text Clause(s)

Scope of Work & Technical Specification

A. General:

The contractor shall be responsible for providing all material, equipment & services, which are required to fulfill the intent of ensuring operability, maintainability, reliability and complete safety of the complete work covered under this specification, irrespective of whether it has been specifically listed herein or not. Omission of specific reference to any component/ accessory necessary for proper performance of the equipment & parts shall not relieve them of the responsibility of providing such facilities to complete the work within quoted price.

The extent of supply under the contract includes all items shown in the drawings, notwithstanding the fact that such items may have been omitted from the specification or schedules. Similarly, the extent of supply also includes all items mentioned in the specification and /or schedules, notwithstanding the fact that such items may have been omitted in the drawing.

Items though not specifically mentioned but needed to make the system complete as stipulated under these specifications are also to be furnished unless otherwise specifically excluded.

The general terms and conditions, instructions to tenderer and other attachment referred to elsewhere are hereby made part of the tender specifications. The equipment/ material and works covered by this specification are subject to compliance to all the attachments referred in the specification. The tenderer shall be responsible for adherence to all requirements stipulated herein.

All work must be carried out in accordance with the requirement of safety guidelines of ATOMIC ENERGY REGULATORY BOARD or equivalent Indian standard and all most HSE regulations applicable. Prior to commencement of any works the contractor will need to supply a site specific method statement for the works and will be required to meet the Engineer In-charge on site.

Scaffolding- scaffolding, platforms etc. shall be provided by the contractor wherever the work is to be done at a height as per safety requirement. Wherever the work is to be done at height as per safety requirement, the contractor shall also erect metallic planks along with scaffolding. The scaffolding material shall be arranged by contractor at his own cost. Scaffolding shall be of TUBULAR PIPES 40NB MS only (IS-1161- 1963, provision BIS no. 3.1 of 4014-I) with suitable and safe clamping arrangement.

On event of placement of order the successful bidder will have to submit programme for completion of the work and get it approved from Engineer-in-charge within 15 days of the placement of LOI / purchase order.

The **MSRL Thickener** shall be guaranteed for satisfactory performance for one year from the date of taking over. Any defect generated or noticed during one year from the date of handing over will have to be rectified by the bidder with no extra cost within 30 days of the information. In case of not rectifying the defect within the stipulated time purchaser will get the defect rectified at risk and cost of the supplier with no further correspondence.

Scope of Supply:

Supply of total material and consumable like Structural Steel, Steel Plates, welding electrode, Bolts, and Gasket of Standard make & paints required for complete work shall be in bidder's scope. In case any item of material is insufficient to carry out the job, the party will have to bring additional quantity for completion of work. No separate payment for such expenditure will be made.

Supply of steel material like MS plate, angle, channel, beam etc. of **SAIL/ Vizag/ JSW/ JINDAL/ Tata steel** make required for complete work as detailed above. The plate & other items shall be supplied in standard lengths.

Supply of materials for rubber lining like raw rubber with less than 25% ash content, solvent & compound for rubber lining etc.

Supply of all consumables of like welding electrodes, gas, grinding wheel, shots for surface preparation by shot blasting of approved make by UCIL.

Supply of painting material, brush, wire brush etc. as per specification of painting.

Necessary bolts, nuts and gaskets for these connections shall also be supplied by the bidder.

Unloading of the material with own arrangement at a site shown by the corporation.

Scope of Work:

B. Dismantling Work:

The detailed scope of work comprises dismantling & replacement jobs of existing MSRL Thickener along with

th its drive system and supporting structure by gas cutting and removing procedure along with removing of its old rubber lining at site as per instruction of Engineer-in-Charge.

The scope shall include arranging of all tools, tackles, manpower, supervision, consumables, non-consumables, machinery, transportation etc., and all other relevant works as per specifications and instructions from UCIL.

Removal of dismantled materials: All dismantled material shall be removed from operation premises as scrap and disposal of same in UCIL's scrap yard as directed. All the scrap being taken out of the operation premises shall be weighed at the store weigh bridge and shall obtain proper pass from engineer-in charge and store before shifting to scrapyards.

Dismantling Procedure: Entire work of demolishing and dismantling shall be carried out very carefully. Prior to start of work, the Contractor shall prepare and submit the proposed scheme of demolishing and dismantling to the Owner for their approval.

i. Contractor shall start the work only after issue of work permit which shall be issued by Engineer-in-charge on daily basis. All the works shall be carried out only after obtaining necessary hot and cold work permit as per UCIL procedures.

ii. Dismantling shall be done in a systematic manner. All elements shall be carefully removed without causing any damage.

iii. Dismantled elements/components shall not be dropped from a height or thrown from a distance so as to avoid damaging the same.

iv. Dismantling of elements (fixed by screws/bolts/hooks etc.) shall be done by taking out the fixtures with proper tools only. Such fixtures may be cut by sawing or flame cuttings, in the event of their being stuck-up due to rusting etc.

v. All tools, tackles and equipments used for dismantling works shall be in good condition and shall have due certification by competent authority, and have valid date for the use.

vi. Where it becomes necessary to disconnect any existing service line(s) (such as electrical, piping etc.) during dismantling operation and where so required by Owner, suitable alternate arrangement shall be made by the Contractor to maintain the continuity and proper functioning of the affected service line(s).

vii. Any blinding if required for positive isolation shall be in the scope of contractor.

viii. Only steel scaffolding is allowed for carrying out the work.

ix. All rules, regulations, statutory laws, labour laws, safety and security practices as may be prevailing or as may be required at the time of execution of the contract has to be strictly adhered to. Contractor shall comply with all laws/statutory requirements including EFPS, EPFS & ESIC etc, in respect of the persons employed.

x. The Contractor shall keep UCIL indemnified against all liabilities and responsibilities.

C. MSRL Thickener:

Fabrication & Erection of thickener with its drive system & supporting structure shall be done as per the standard engineering practices or provided drawing and as per instruction of Engineer-in-charge. The contractor will bring all necessary tools, tackles, ARC welding sets, TIG welding sets, Gas cutting sets, grinders, chain pulley blocks, wire rope/slings, D-shackles etc for the job along with the consumable as follows:

1. All metal arc welding shall be carried out as per IS: 9595-1980. Welding Electrode conforms: IS: 814-199
1. Specification of Welding Electrode: AWS: A5.1: E6013, IS: ER4221X, **Make: ESAB/D & H Secheron/ L& T/ Ador only.**

2. Arrangement of suitable scaffolding material of tubular type, erection of the same to work at any height required for the specific job, from inside/outside equipment as required.

a. Arranging all tested tools and tackles, safety items, ladders, scaffolding etc. required for the completion of the job.

b. Arranging for plate bending machine and transport facility for shifting of man & material.

3. Fabrication Specification:

a. WELDING PROCESS: MANUAL METAL ARC TO IS-9595

b. WELDING ELECTRODES:

i. S.S.316 TO S.S.316 AWS -E-316.

ii. S.S.316 TO M.S. AWS E-309Mo.

iii. M.S. TO M.S. AWS-E-6013.

c. WELDING SYMBOLS: IS -813.

d. Make: ESAB/D & H Secheron/ L&TI Ador only.

Fabrication of the Thickener as per the supplied drawing and as per the site decision of the Engineer-in-charge.

Consumables such as oxygen gas, acetylene gas, DP test kit, grinding wheel, hacksaw blades, wire brushes etc to be brought by contractor. Any other item or work not specifically mentioned above but required for the completion of fabrication, erection & dismantling of the thickener will have to be arranged by the party with no extra payment.

Painting- The Thickener outside surface shall be painted with two coats of Red oxide zinc chromate primer followed by two coats of Synthetic Enamel finish paint. Paint should be Smoke Grey 1st quality (Make: Berger/ Shalimar/ J&N).

Painting means complete preparation of surface by cleaning by wire brushing, applying primer as per specification, applying finish paint as per specification.

a) Manual or hand tool cleaning is used only where safety problems limit the application of other surface preparation procedure and hence does not appear in the tables of paint systems. Hand tool cleaning normally consists of the following with the help of only non-sparking tools / Emery cloth.

b) Irrespective of the method of surface preparation, the first coat of primer must be applied by brush on dry surface. This should be done immediately and in any case within 4 hours of cleaning of surface. Otherwise the same shall be prepared again before application of the paint. However, at times of unfavorable weather conditions, the Engineer-in-Charge shall have the liberty to control the time period, at his sole discretion and / or to insist on re cleaning, as may be required, before primer application is taken up.

c) After surface preparation, the primer should be applied only by spray/manual application and no relaxation will be made on this account. The paint being supplied shall be first grade high gloss synthetic enamel paint. Nos. of coats of paint shall be two or more to achieve the good finish. Time gap between applications of subsequent coats shall be more than 8 hrs but less than 3 days.

D. Rubber Lining:

Rubber lining of fabricated thickener as per IS-4682 followed by shot blasting of surfaces conforming to standard including supply of required rubber and rubber lining material.

Surface preparation of the thickener inside surfaces with shot blasting to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-charge to get a good rubber lining.

Surface Preparation- Inside surface to be thoroughly cleaned and then shot blasted in order to remove all rust and scale to facilitate rubber lining as per IS-4682, Part-I. Perfect surface preparation is to be carried out in order to expose metallic surface to SA 2 ½. Surface preparation shall be done by grit-blasting method (SA 2 1/2). All shot blasted areas will be checked for proper surface profile using surface profile comparator as per Standard Test Methods for Field Measurement of Surface Profile of Blast Cleaned Steel-ASTM-D4417-3. All foreign matter will be removed by buffing, burning or washing with solvent and will conform to IS-4682 part-I specification. The surface is also inspected for pit, crevices and pin holes if any are found, repair by patch work. After blasting is complete, priming will begin a maximum of four hours after. Solution (solvent + rubber -> rubber adhesive sealant) will be applied in a consistent manner to give a smooth, uniform coverage. Surfaces after applying solution will not be exposed to sunlight and/or weather. Applying solution to blasted surfaces on three steps- (a) Metal primer (b) intermediate solution (c) tack solution. Solution will be allowed enough drying time to form a dry or tacky film. All solution applied parts or areas will be kept free from all contamination during the drying period.

Rubber lining of thickener by hot process to achieve uniform polymerization and required hardness by use of steam at controlled rate. Rubber sheets of 3 mm and 6mm thickness shall be put in layers as detailed in Technical specification of rubber lining.

Arrangement of blower and shot blasting facility for surface preparation.

Arrangement of boiler, coal or electricity for steam generation for hot vulcanization of the rubber lining.

Removal of all scraps separately to designated area within 5 km range as directed by the Engineer-in-charge.

Technical Specification of Rubber lining: Rubber lining all over inside as per IS- 4682, PART -I, **Thickness of lining all over 6mm thk.**

The rubber lining is cut to the desired size and shape on a clean table. Once desired size and shape is achieved, one side of the rubber lining is coated with tack solution and applied to the blasted and solution applied surfaces. After rubber lining material is applied, it is rolled down using steady and firm overlapping strokes with a roller of 65mm maximum width. Care is taken not to stretch or apply tension to the rubber lining. The rolling action starts in the centre of the rubber lining material and is worked towards the edges. This is essential to remove any air out from behind the lining and ensure a proper bond is achieved. Rubber lining will be seamed together using lap joints

Properties of Hard Rubber

- a) Hardness = shore "D" $60 \pm 5^\circ$.
- b) Ash Content = 25 %.(maximum).
- c) Minimum value of adhesion = 3.6 Kgf/cm
- d) Method of Vulcanizing - AUTOCLAVE VULCANIZING.
- e) TOLERANCE: RUBBER LINING THICKNESS = $\pm 10\%$.

Contractor has to provide test certificate of all physical properties mentioned above.

Arranging for all testing instruments and tools for check of rubber lining quality and thickness of material.

Inspection/Testing:

1. Visual & dimensional checking, D.P. test on weld (100%).
2. Surface preparation- as per Standard Test Methods for Field Measurement of Surface Profile of Blast Cleaned Steel-ASTM- D4417-3.
3. Raw material - rubber with test certificate from approved laboratories & UCIL's CR&D results.
4. Duro-meter check for hardness test.
5. High voltage spark test for locating any possible pin-holes leaks on rubber lining as per IS-4682 Part-I.

6. The particulars of the proposed tests and the procedure for the tests shall be submitted to the Engineer-In charge for approval before conducting the tests. The successful bidder shall submit QAP (quality assurance plan). All necessary items as required for inspection and testing of the tank including instruments shall be arranged by the bidder.

Material Test Certificate:

Material test certificate of the govt. Approved house for the rubber lining material & manufacture's test certificate for the steel material are to be submitted before applying the materials. If test certificate for the material is not available from main producer, the following tests shall be carried out at the discretion of UCIL: a. chemical composition, b. mechanical properties, c. weld-ability test.

RETURN OF UNUSED MATERIAL

a) All unused/ scrap materials shall be the property of the UCIL and shall be returned in good and acceptable condition size wise, category wise by the Contractor at his own cost to UCIL's Store(s)/ at the allocated area within plant premises.

b) No credit will be given to the Contractor for return of scrap. The Contractor should quote the rates accordingly.

c) In case the Contractor fails to return unused/ scrap materials, then recovery for such quantity of materials, not returned by the Contractor shall be affected at 125% of item rates from the Contractor's bills or from any other dues of the Contractor to the UCIL. Contractor shall make his own arrangements for weighing the off cuts to be returned to UCIL's stores.

d) The wastage generated by the Contractor in excess of the allowable percentage shall also be charged at the penal rates (125% of item rate).

e) Wastage /scrap allowance permitted will be 5.0 % (five percentage). Wastage more than this will be deducted from the contractors bill based on 125% of item rate at the time of billing.

f) Fabrication & rubber lining scrap will be the property of the corporation.

General Scope of Work

The contractor will have to maintain accountability of materials issued to them in a register which include specification of materials, date of issue, quantity, cost code, I.V. No and purpose. Contractor has to make own arrangement of issuing the material from store. SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT- SCOC

1. Prices:

Unless otherwise agreed to specifically in order, the price payable by UCIL to the contractor under the order shall remain firm throughout the period of contract and shall not be subject to any escalation.

If the works are provided by the contractor in accordance with this contract, Corporation will pay the contractor the price (awarded value); and reimburse the contractor for the approved expenses (as specified in the order/ contract), after the approved expenses have been incurred by the contractor. Corporation will not be liable to reimburse the contractor for expenses other than approved expenses, unless Corporation's prior approved written consent.

Bidders have to quote rate on GeM portal including GST applicable as on bid due date. The ContractSum is the "price inclusive GST", i.e. inclusive of GST of quoted value and all taxes & duties and all other statutory levies applicable, including costs and expenses which may be required in and for the supply, scope of work and completion of the work described, together with all general risks, liabilities and obligations set forth or implied in the document upon which the tender is based.

The reimbursable costs as mentioned in the tender document shall be inclusive of GST, will be in extra on submission of valid required documents & valid tax invoices as per prevailing rate of GST payable in accordance with GST Act at the time of submission of invoices subjected to any additions or deductions due to variation under adjustment/ quantities clause and statutory variation/imposition/ abolishment of taxes and duties, if applicable & pursuant to the contract.

2. Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) / Bid Security:

Earnest Money Deposit (EMD)/ Bid Security shall be deposited by way of demand draft (DD) drawn in favor of "URANIUM CORPORATION OF INDIA LIMITED" payable at JADUGUDA Branch of State Bank of India [Jaduguda Branch Code no 0227]. E.M.D. shall not bear any interest.

The offers received from tenderers without EMD and/or tender cost shall be summarily rejected except where exemption is provided in the tender.

Earnest Money Deposit may be converted and adjusted into Security Deposit in the case of successful tenderer. The earnest money of unsuccessful tenderers will be refunded on written request (in duplicate) to the Engineer-In-charge after commencement of work under this contract.

The EMD / Bid Security will be forfeited and is liable to GST at applicable rate, if

- i. The Tenderer modifies or withdraws his offer after due date and time of submission of the bid.
- ii. The Tenderer resiles from his offer during the validity period.

- iii. The tender is revoked during its validity period by the Tenderer or any other breach of the bid.
- iv. The Tenderer increases the prices unilaterally after the opening of Part I (techno-commercial) and during the validity period of the tender.
- v. Subsequent to acceptance of the Letter of Award of Contract by the successful Tenderer, the Tenderer refuses to enter into Contract Agreement within the specified time or its authorized extensions.
- vi. The successful Tenderer fails to submit the Performance Guarantee (Security Deposit) within the period specified, if applicable.
- vii. The Tenderer does not accept the correction of the Bid Price, by submission of updated bid.

The EMD/ Bid Security of the successful Tenderer to whom the contract is awarded will be returned or adjusted into Security Deposit (SD) after the said Tenderer provides the Contract Performance Guarantee/ Security Deposit (SD) and signs the Contract Agreement.

If the successful Tenderer fails to submit Contract Performance Guarantee/ Security Deposit (SD) as specified within 30 (thirty) days after the date of issue of Letter of Award of Contract, or fails to sign the contract agreement then the EMD/ Bid Security amount will be forfeited by the Corporation, without any notice or proof of damages etc.

3. Validity of Tender:

Bids shall be kept valid for period specified in GeM Portal from the final Due date of submission of bid'. A Bid valid for a shorter period may be rejected by UCIL as 'nonresponsive'. The Tenderers shall not be allowed to increase, amend or withdraw his tender within this period and if he does so the earnest money deposit and security deposit may be forfeited.

If required, the Corporation may request the Tenderer to extend the "bid validity period". The request and responses thereto shall be made in writing or through GeM portal, if a tenderer accepts to extend the period of validity of bid. The tenderer accepting such request shall not modify their bid on their own. A Tenderer may refuse the request to extend the bid validity period without forfeiture of his EMD.

4. Deviation:

ZERO DEVIATION: Deviation to terms and conditions of "Bidding Documents" may lead to rejection of bid. UCIL will accept bids based on terms & conditions of "Bidding Documents" only. Bidder may note UCIL will determine the substantial responsiveness of each bid to the Bidding Documents. For purpose of this, a substantially responsive bid is one which conforms to all terms and conditions of the Bidding Documents without deviations or reservations. UCIL's determination of a bid's responsiveness is based on the content of the bid itself without recourse to extrinsic evidence. UCIL reserves the right to raise technical and/or commercial query(s), if required, may be raised on the bidder(s). The response(s) to the same shall be in writing, and no change in the price(s) or substance of the bids shall be sought, offered or permitted. The substance of the bid includes but not limited to prices.

5. Award of Contract:

The Corporation will award the Contract to the successful Tenderer, whose bid/updated bid has been determined to be substantially responsive and to be the lowest evaluated bid, provided that the Tenderer is determined to be qualified to perform the Contract satisfactorily.

6. Privilege Clause:

The Corporation reserves the right to accept or reject any Tender, and to cancel the Tender process and reject all Tenders, at any time prior to the award of Contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected Tenderer or Tenderers or any obligation to inform the affected Tenderer or Tenderers of the grounds for the Corporation's action.

7. SECURITY DEPOSIT (SD):

Total amount of Security deposit shall be limited to 10 % of the awarded value of work. Fifty percent of this amount shall have to be deposited as initial security deposit at the time of execution of agreement including the amount deposited as Earnest Money.

a. Acceptable mode of payment of Initial Security Deposit/ Earnest Money:

I. For deposit upto Rs. 5,000/- : Demand Draft payable at SBI, Jaduguda/ Hartopa.

II. For deposit beyond Rs. 5,000/- and up to Rs. 1.00 Lakh.: DAC/TDR/FDR etc. from any Schedule Banks duly pledged in favour of UCIL. But in case of Earnest Money of amount more than Rs. 50,000/-, the Tenderer should submit Bank Guarantee issued by Nationalized bank as mentioned in Para 9(a) (iii).

III. For deposit beyond Rs. 1.00 Lakhs: Bank Guarantee issued by Scheduled bank of jointly, severally bound with the Contractor to the purchaser for the amount same above. The terms of the said guarantee shall be such as shall be approved by the purchaser and the obtaining of such guarantee and the cost of guarantee to be so entered shall be at the expenses, in all respects, of the Contractor. The said guarantee shall be valid till the expiry of the defect liability period and issue of the final certificate by the Engineer, and with a claim period of Six months beyond its required validity.

IV. In addition to the above, if contractor failed to submit the security deposit, S.D. value of the work will be deducted from the 1st / subsequent Running Account bills by way of percentage deductions. Such percentage deduction shall be @ 10 % of the running account bills till the full amount of security deposit is realized/ retained by the Corporation.

b. All compensation or other sums of money payable by the Contractor under the terms of this contract or any other contract or any other account whatsoever may be deducted from or paid by sale of a sufficient part of his security deposit or from the interest arising there from or from any sums which may be due or be come due to the Contractor by the Corporation or any account whatsoever and in the event of his security deposit be reduced by reason of any such deduction or sale as aforesaid, the Contractor shall within fourteen days of receipt of notice of demand from the Engineer-in-charge make good the deficit.

c. REFUND OF SECURITY DEPOSIT:

Security Deposit (SD) shall be refunded to the Contractor on the Engineer-in-charge certifying in writing that the work has been completed as per condition **Penalty (Liquidated Damage clauses hereof etc against submission of a Performance Bank Guarantee (PBG) for 10 % of the work order value**

Or You will be given the option to convert SD BG in to PBG and on expiry of the Defects liability period (referred to in condition Penalty (Liquidated Damage clauses hereof) or after payment of the Final bill payable whichever is later, the Engineer-in-charge shall on request from the Contractor refund to him the security deposit provided the Engineer-in-charge is satisfied that there is no demand outstanding against the Contractor.

8. FORFEITURE OF SD:

The SD shall stand forfeited in favour of UCIL, without any further notice to the contractor in the following circumstances:

- In case of any failure whatsoever on the part of the contractor at any time during performance of his part of the contract including the extended periods of contract, where notice is given and time for rectification allowed.
- If the contractor indulges at any time in any subletting/ sub-contracting of any portion of the work without approval of UCIL.

9. Contract Agreement:

Contract Agreement should be executed in prescribed format on a non-judicial stamped paper within 30 (thirty) days from the date of issue of work order / L.O.I. However, no payment will be made without execution of contract agreement.

Within 30 days of issue of LOI, the successful Tenderer shall sign and date the contract and return it to the Corporation. Till the contract is signed, the LOI issued to the successful Tenderer shall remain binding amongst the two parties.

In the event of failure on the part of the successful Tenderer to sign the contract within the period specified above or any other time period specified by Corporation, UCIL reserves the right to terminate the LOI issued to the successful Tenderer and invokes the Bid Security or the Performance Security if submitted by the successful Tenderer/ action as per declaration for Bid Security.

10. Payment Terms:

- i. No advance will be paid by UCIL towards the above work.
- ii. 70% of the cost of steel material including taxes & duties on pro-rata basis will be paid within 30 days after receipt & inspection.

- iii. 70% of the cost of rubber lining material including taxes & duties on pro-rata basis will be paid within 30 days after receipt & inspection.
- iv. 70% of the cost of dismantling on pro-rata basis will be paid after certification by the Engineer - in-charge.
- v. 70% of the cost of fabrication & erection on pro-rata basis will be paid after certification by the Engineer - in-charge.
- vi. 70% of the cost of rubber lining on pro-rata basis will be paid after certification by the Engineer - in-charge.
- vii. 100% of the cost of dismantling, erection & alignment of thickener drive & its structure on pro-rata basis will be paid after certification by the Engineer - in-charge.
- viii. 90% of the total order value after adjustment of payment made against sl. no. (ii), (iii), (iv), (v) & (vi) above on pro-rata basis will be released within 30 days of successful completion of the job in all respect & taking over the thickener after inspection.
- ix. Balance 10% of the order value on pro-rata basis will be released within 3 months of the taking over on submission of performance bank guarantee of equal amount valid for 12 months from the date of taking over.

11. Tax & Duties:

The Contractor shall:

- a. Pay and indemnify the Corporation against all taxes, duties, goods and services tax and duties, charges, taxes payable in connection with the carrying out of Work under Contract; and
- b. Provide all security required under any statutory requirement as security for the payment of any duties, charges, and taxes.

12. INCOME TAX & STATUTORY LEVIES:

Income Tax at the prevailing rate as applicable from time-to-time shall be deducted from CONTRACTOR's bills as per Income Tax and quoted rates shall be deemed to include this. As regards the Income Tax, surcharge on Income Tax or any other Corporate Tax or Statutory levy payable by the Tenderer for reason of the Contract awarded, then Corporation shall not bear any tax liability whatsoever, irrespective of the mode of construction of contract. The Tenderer both Indian and/or foreign shall be liable and responsible for payment of such tax, if attracted under the provision of Law of Land.

13. Insurance:

The contractor shall ensure & maintain insurance against his liability for accident or injury to workmen or machineries used for the work and shall submit 2 (two) copies of the policy & receipt (s) of premiums paid or satisfactory evidence of insurance coverage at their own cost valid for whole contract period at a time for all the persons to be engaged to the Engineer-In-charge, UCIL before the commencement of work. Contractor shall also submit the proof of renewal of the same policy at least 2 (two) days before the expiry date of the previous policy to the Engineer-In-charge, UCIL. The contractor will not be allowed to carry out any activity without necessary insurance coverage (mentioning working height depend upon the job requirements and as per insurance rules) of their persons. Insurance policy shall also indemnify UCIL against any claim raised by the injured / affected workmen or his family.

14. Indemnity:

Contractor will fully indemnify the corporation against all responsibility, any costs or expenses (including legal costs on an indemnity basis) and Claims of contractor's workmen in respect of personal injury or death or loss of, or damage to or interference with, any other property (whether real or personal), third party or to corporations' personnel and properties. **Contractor shall abide by all the necessary provisions of various other Labour Laws/Acts viz. ESI/Bonus, Workmen's Compensation, EPF and any other laws and rules applicable, in this regard. If on account of non-compliance with the provisions of any laws, Corporation is called upon to make any payment to or in respect of his employees, the service provider shall fully reimburse to Corporation for all such payment and Corporation shall be free to make deductions on this account from the amount of Performance Security Deposit and retention money.**

15. Penalty (Liquidated Damage):

a. Liquidated Damages (LD) shall be levied where reasons are attributable to supplier / contractors for delays in execution of purchase order/ contract. LD shall be levied @0.5% per week or part thereof on the value of unfinished supply/work order for each week of delay subject to a maximum of 5% of the total value of contract (excluding Taxes and Duties). LD is liable to GST at applicable rate.

b. For the portion of delay which is attributable to UCIL / force majeure or to the supplier / contractor, the case shall be dealt with as follows :

I. Delay attributable to UCIL / Force majeure:

LD	Not Applicable
Taxes & Duties	Any increase in taxes and duties on account of statutory increase, fresh imposition of any duty or taxes which take place during such extended period shall be admissible.
Price Variation	Price variation, if indicated in the Work Order/ Purchase Order, shall be applicable during such extended period.

II. Delay attributable to Supplier / Contractor:

LD	Applicable
Taxes & Duties	Increase / fresh imposition of taxes and duties during the extended period will be to the account of the supplier/contractor. Any decrease in taxes and duties during the extended period will be available by UCIL.
Price Variation	Price variation, if indicated in the contract will be applicable for the work performed within the scheduled period of contract. For work executed during the extended delivery period, the rates as prevailing on the last day of the scheduled contract period only may be paid. De-escalation/ reduction, if any, which takes place, shall have to be passed on to UCIL

c. The payment of liquidated damages shall not relieve the Contractor from its obligation to complete the Works.

16. Variation in Price:

Unless the **Clause Price Adjustment** provides otherwise the rates and prices quoted by the Tenderer shall be fixed for the duration of the Contract and shall not be subject to adjustment or any account.

17. Termination for Insolvency:

The Corporation may at any time terminate the Contract by giving written notice of four weeks to the Contractor, without any compensation to the Contractor, if the Contractor becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent.

18. Defaults, Breaches, Termination, and closure of Contract

1) Termination due to Breach, Default, and Insolvency

a) Defaults and Breach of Contract

In case the contractor undergoes insolvency or receivership; neglects or defaults, or expresses inability or disinclination to honour his obligations relating to the performance of the contract or ethical standards or a

ny other obligation that substantively affects the Procuring Entity's rights and benefits under the contract, it shall be treated as a breach of Contract. Such defaults could include inter-alia:

i. Default in Performance and Obligations: if the contractor fails to deliver any or all of the Services or fails to perform any other contractual obligations (including Code of Integrity or obligation to maintain eligibility and Qualifications based on which contract was awarded) within the period stipulated in the contract or within any extension thereof granted by the Procuring Entity.

ii. Insolvency: If the contractor being an individual or if a firm, any partner thereof, shall at any time, be adjudged insolvent or shall have a receiving order or order for the administration of his estate made against him or shall take any proceeding for composition under any Insolvency Act for the time being in force or make any conveyance or assignment of his effects or enter into any assignment or composition with his creditors or suspend payment or if the firm be dissolved under the Partnership Act, or

iii. Liquidation: if the contractor is a company being wound up voluntarily, or by order of a Court or a Receiver, Liquidator or Manager on behalf of the Debenture-holders is appointed, or circumstances shall have arisen which entitle the Court or Debenture-holders to appoint a Receiver, Liquidator or Manager.

b) Notice for Default:

As soon as a breach of contract is noticed, a show-cause 'Notice of Default' shall be issued to the contractor, giving two weeks' notice, reserving the right to invoke contractual remedies. After such a show-cause notice, all payments to the contractor would be temporarily withheld to safeguard needed recoveries that may become due on invoking contractual remedies.

c) Terminations for Default

i. Notice for Termination for Default: In the event of unsatisfactory resolution of 'Notice of Default' within two weeks of its issue as per sub-clause above, the Procuring Entity, if so decided, shall by written Notice of Termination for Default sent to the contractor, terminate the contract in whole or in part, without compensation to the contractor.

ii. Such termination shall not prejudice or affect the rights and remedies, including under sub-clause below, which have accrued and/ or shall accrue to the Procuring Entity after that.

iii. Unless otherwise instructed by the Procuring Entity, the contractor shall continue to perform the contract to the extent not terminated.

iv. All Defect Liability obligations, if any, shall continue to survive despite the termination.

d) Contractual Remedies for Breaches/ Defaults or Termination for Default

If there is an unsatisfactory resolution within this period, the Procuring Entity shall take one; or more of the following contractual remedies.

i. Temporary withhold payments due to the contractor till recoveries due to invocation of other contractual remedies are complete.

ii. Call back any loaned property or advances of payment, if any, with a levy of interest at the prevailing rate (MIBID - Mumbai Inter bank Bid Rate).

iii. Recover liquidated damages and invoke denial clause for delays.

iv. Encash and/ or Forfeit performance or other contractual securities.

v. Prefer claims against insurances, if any.

vi. Terminate Contract for default, fully or partially including its right for Risk-and-Cost Procurement as per following sub-clause.

vii. **Risk and Cost Procurement:** In addition to termination for default, the Procuring Entity shall be entitled, and it shall be lawful on his part, to procure Services similar to those terminated, with such terms and conditions and in such manner as it deems fit at the "Risk and Cost" of the contractor. Such Risk and Cost Procurement must be contracted within six months from the breach of Contract. The contractor shall be liable for any loss which the Procuring Entity may sustain on that account provided the procurement, or, if there is an agreement to procure, such agreement is made. The contractor shall not be entitled to any gain on such procurement, and the manner and method of such procurement shall be in the entire discretion of the Procuring Entity. It shall not be necessary for the Procuring Entity to notify the contractor of such proc

urement. It shall, however, be at the discretion of the Procuring Entity to collect or not the security deposit from the firm/ firms on whom the contract is placed at the risk and cost of the defaulted firm.

Note: Regarding the Services that are not readily available in the market and where procurement difficulties are experienced, the period for making risk procurement shall be nine months instead of six months provided above.

viii. Initiate proceedings in a court of law for the transgression of a law, tort, and loss, not addressable by the above means.

e) Limitation of Liability

Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, the aggregate liability of the contractor to the Procuring Entity, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total Contract Price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment, or to any obligation of the contractor to indemnify the Procuring Entity concerning IPR infringement.

2) Termination for Default/ Convenience of Procuring Entity and Frustration

a) Notice for Determination of Contract

i. The Procuring Entity reserves the right to terminate the contract, in whole or in part for its (the Procuring Entity's) convenience or frustration of Contract as per sub-clause below, by serving written 'Notice for Determination of Contract' on the contractor at any time during the currency of the contract. The notice shall specify that the termination is for the convenience of the Procuring Entity or the frustration of the contract. The notice shall also indicate inter-alia, the extent to which the contractor's performance under the contract is terminated, and the date with effect from which such termination shall become effective.

ii. Such termination shall not prejudice or affect the rights and remedies accrued and/ or shall accrue after that to the Parties.

iii. Unless otherwise instructed by the Procuring Entity, the contractor shall continue to perform the contract to the extent not terminated.

iv. All Defect Liability obligations, if any, shall continue to survive despite the termination.

v. The Services and incidental goods/ works that can be delivered or performed within thirty days after the contractor's receipt of the notice of termination shall be accepted by the Procuring Entity as per the contract terms. For the remaining Services and incidental goods/ works, the Procuring Entity may decide:

1. To get any portion of the balance completed and delivered at the contract terms, conditions, and prices; and/ or
2. To cancel the remaining portion of the Services and incidental goods/ works and compensate the contractor by paying an agreed amount for the cost incurred by the contractor, if any, towards the remaining portion of the Services and incidental goods/ works.

b) Frustration of Contract

i. Notice of Frustration Event: Upon a supervening cause occurring after the effective date of the contract, including a change in law, beyond the control of either party whether as a result of the Force Majeure clause or within the scope of section 56 of the Indian Contract Act, 1872, that makes it impossible to perform the contract within a reasonable time frame, the affected party shall give a 'Notice of Frustration Event' to the other party giving justification. The parties shall use reasonable efforts to agree to amend the contract, as may be necessary to complete its performance. However, if the parties cannot reach a mutual agreement within 60 days of the initial notice, the Procuring Entity shall issue a 'Notice for Determining the contract' and terminate the contract due to its frustration as in the sub-clause above.

ii. However, the following shall not be considered as such a supervening cause

iii. Lack of commercial feasibility or viability or profitability or availability of funds

iv. If caused by either party's breach of its obligations under this Contract or failure to act in good faith or use commercially reasonable due diligence to prevent such an event.

3) Closure of Contract

The contract shall stand closed upon

1. Successful performance of all obligations by both parties, including completion of Defect Liability obligations and final payment.
2. Termination and settlements after that, if any, as per Termination due to Breach, Default, and Insolvency or Termination for Default/ Convenience of Procuring Entity and Frustration.

19. Statutory Variation Clause:

Unless otherwise stated in the contract, statutory increase in applicable GST rate only during the original delivery period shall be to Procuring Entity's account. Any increase in the rates of GST beyond the original completion date during the extended delivery period shall be borne by the contractor.

The benefit of any reduction in GST rate must be passed on to the Procuring Entity during the original and extended delivery period. However, GST rate amendments shall be considered for quoted HSN code only, against documentary evidence, provided such an increase of GST rates takes place after the last date of bid submission.

20. Time for Delivery of services and Extensions Thereof

The time and uninterrupted delivery of Services shall be deemed to be the essence of the contract. Subject to any requirement in the contract as to the completion of any portions or portions of the Services before completion of the whole; the contractor shall fully and finally complete the whole of the services comprised in the contract as per the Delivery and Completion Schedule stipulated in Format 1.1: Description of Services. If at any time during the currency of the contract, the contractor encounters conditions hindering the timely performance of services, the contractor shall promptly inform the Procuring Entity in writing about the same and its likely duration. He must make a request to the Procuring Entity for an extension of the delivery schedule. On receiving the contractor's communication, the Procuring Entity shall examine the situation and, at its discretion, may agree to extend the completion schedule, with or without liquidated damages and with and without denial clause by issuing an amendment to the contract in terms of the following clauses.

20.1 Extension Due to Modification

The Contract Manager might grant a reasonable extension of the completion date if any modifications ordered materially increase the time for delivery of the services. The contractor shall be responsible for requesting such extension of the date as soon as the cause thereof shall arise and in any case not less than one month before the expiry of the date fixed for completion of the services.

20.2 Extension for Delay Not Due to Contractor

If in the opinion of the contractor, the progress of Services has any time been delayed due to following reasons, then within 15 days of such happening causing delay, he shall give notice thereof in writing to the Contract Manager, but shall nevertheless do due diligence to bring down or make good the delays and to proceed with the services:

- a) any act or neglect of other contractor employed by the Procuring Entity or in executing the work/service not forming part of the contract but on which Contractor's performance necessarily depends or
- b) proceeding taken or threatened by or dispute with external third parties arising otherwise than from the contractor's own default etc. or
- c) any act or neglect of Procuring Entity's employees or
- d) delay authorized by the Contract Manager pending arbitration or
- e) the contractor not having received in due time necessary instructions from the Procuring Entity for which he shall have especially applied in writing to the Contract Manager or his authorized representative.
- f) hand over possession of the site or the necessary facilities/ documents/ data or instructions by the Procuring Entity to the contractor or
- g) give the necessary notice to commence the services, or
- h) Any other delay caused by the Procuring Entity due to any other cause whatsoever.
- i) The contractor may also indicate the period for which the Services is likely to be delayed and ask for a necessary extension of time. On receipt of such request from the contractor, the Contract Manager shall consider the same and grant such extension of time as in his opinion is reasonable regarding the nature and p

eriod of delay and the type and quantum of work affected thereby. No other compensation shall be payable for works so carried forward to the extended period. The same rates, terms, and conditions as the original Contract shall apply during the extended period.

20.3 Extension of Time for Delay Due to Contractor

If the contractor fails to deliver the Services within the fixed/ extended period for reasons other than those stipulated in contract, the Procuring Entity may, if satisfied that the service delivery can still be completed within a reasonable time, extend the period further.

On such extension, the Procuring Entity shall be entitled without prejudice to any other right and remedy available on that behalf to recover from the contractor as agreed damages and not by way of penalty Liquidated Damages as per contract clauses.

Provided further, that if the Procuring Entity is not satisfied that the service can be completed by the contractor or in the event of failure on the part of the contractor to complete the service within the extension of time allowed further as aforesaid, the Procuring Entity shall be entitled without prejudice to any other right or remedy available in that behalf, treat the delay as a breach of contract and avail any or all the remedies thereunder, whether or not actual damage is caused by such default.

Inordinate Delays: Delays due to the contractor of more than one-fourth (25%) of the total completion period shall be treated as inordinate delays. Such inordinate delays shall be noted as poor performance and be held against the contractor in future tenders. A show-cause notice shall be issued to the contractor before declaring it a poor performance. Such delays may be considered as a breach of the contract at the option of the Procuring Entity.

21. Suspension of Services

21.1 Suspension Ordered by Contract Manager

The contractor shall, on the order of the Contract Manager, suspend the progress of the Services or any part thereof for such time or times and in such manner as the Contract Manager may consider necessary, and shall during such suspension, adequately protect and secure the site and assets so far as is necessary in the opinion of the Contract Manager. If such suspension is -Provided for in the contract, or Necessary for the proper execution of the Services or because of extraneous conditions or by some default on the part of the contractor and or Necessary for the safety of the Services or any part thereof

21.2 Extension of Time and Compensation

The contractor shall not be entitled to the extra costs, if any, incurred by him during the period of suspension of the service, but in the event of any suspension ordered by the Contract Manager for reasons other than an aforementioned and when each such period of suspension exceeds 14 days, the Contract Manager shall extend the time of service for completion of the Services as he may consider proper, having regard to the period or periods of such suspensions and such compensations as the Contract Manager may consider reasonable in respect of expenses incurred by the contractor during the periods of such suspension.

21.3 Suspension Lasting More Than 3 Months

If the Contract Manager suspends the Services or any part thereof for more than three months at a time, the contractor may serve a written notice on the Contract Manager requesting permission to proceed with the suspended part(s) of service. If such permission is not granted within 15 days from the receipt thereof, the contractor by further written notice may, treat the suspended part(s) of the service as deleted from the Contract. If the whole of the services has been suspended, he may treat it as a breach of the contract by the Procuring Entity and avail any or all remedies provided in this regard in the contract.

21.4 Force Majeure

a) On the occurrence of any unforeseen event, beyond the control of either Party, directly interfering with the delivery of Services arising during the currency of the contract, such as war, hostilities, acts of the public enemy, civil commotion, sabotage, fires, floods, explosions, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, lockouts, or acts of God, the affected Party shall, within a week from the commencement thereof, notify the same in writing to the other Party with reasonable evidence thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the Procuring Entity in writing, the contractor shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as reasonably practicable and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the Force Majeure event.

If the force majeure condition(s) mentioned above be in force for 90 days or more at any time, either party

shall have the option to terminate the contract on expiry of 90 days of commencement of such force majeure by giving 14 days' notice to the other party in writing. In case of such termination, no damages shall be claimed by either party against the other, save and except those which had occurred under any other clause of this Contract before such termination.

b) Notwithstanding the remedial provisions contained in Damages and Deductions Thereof and Termination due to Breach, Default, and Insolvency, none of the Party shall seek any such remedies or damages for the delay and/ or failure of the other Party in fulfilling its obligations under the contract if it is the result of an event of Force Majeure.

22. Defects Liability Period:

The defect liability period / guarantee period for this job shall be 12 months from the certified date of handing over of job. The contractor shall rectify the defects, if any, detected / reported during the guarantee period under this tender from the certified date of completion of work. The contractor shall be responsible to make good and remedy at his own expense within such period, as may be stipulated by the Engineer-In charge before the expiry of the guarantee period.

23. Permits, Approvals and Licenses:

Whenever the delivery of Services and incidental Goods/ Works requires the contractor to obtain permits, approvals, and licenses from local public authorities, it shall be the contractor's sole responsibility to obtain these and keep these current and valid. Such requirements may include but not be restricted to licences or environmental clearance if required. If requested by the contractor, the Procuring Entity shall make its best effort to assist the contractor in complying with such requirements in a timely and expeditious manner, without any dilution of the Contractor's responsibility in this regard.

24. Labour Codes and Related Obligations

24.1. Independent Contractor

The contractor's status shall be that of an independent contractor and Primary Employer of staff deployed during the contract by him or his sub-contractors or other associates. The contractor, its employees, agents, and subcontractors performing under this Contract are not employees or agents of the Procuring Organisation or Procuring Entity or Central or State Government or their agencies/ Enterprises, simply by Services delivered under this Contract.

24.2. Obligations of the contractor under Labour Codes and Rules

a) In cases where Services are to be performed by the contractor at the premises of the Procuring Entity or Beneficiary of Services, the contractor shall comply with the provisions of the Labour Codes including Code on Wages, 2019, The Industrial Relations Code 2020, Code on the Social Security 2020, and The Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions 2020, and Draft Rules made there under, as modified from time to time, wherever applicable and shall also indemnify the Procuring Entity from and against any claims under the aforesaid Labour codes and the Rules.

b) The contractor shall obtain a valid licence under the aforesaid Labour codes and the Rules as modified from time to time before the commencement of the contract and continue to have a valid licence until the completion of the contract. Any failure to fulfill this requirement, the Procuring Entity shall treat it as a breach of contract for default as per the contract and avail any or all remedies there under.

c) In respect of all labour directly or indirectly employed in the contract for the performance of the contractor's part of the contract, the contractor shall comply with or cause to comply with the provisions of the aforesaid Labour codes and the Rules wherever applicable. The contractor shall be solely responsible for submitting all the necessary returns under these Codes and the Rules. Nevertheless, the contractor shall submit monthly returns to the Procuring Entity to confirm compliance with such Codes and rules. Failure to do so shall entitle Procuring Entity to take any measure to ensure compliance to such codes and rules by the contractor and his associates, including, but not limited to, withholding contractor's on-account bills.

d) The contractor shall pay the wages as per the Code on Wages to their workers not below the rate of minimum wages, as notified by the State Government or Central Government, whichever is higher, through the bank transfer. The contractor shall, notwithstanding the contract's provisions to the contrary, cause to be paid the wages to labour directly or indirectly engaged on the contract, including any engaged by his Sub-Contractors in connection with the said contract as if he had immediately employed the labour. The Procuring Entity shall, without any commitments or being obliged to do, may its discretion, monitor that such payments are being made. The contractor shall be required to submit, every month, documentary evidence in

the form of a Bank Statement of having transferred the gross minimum wages to each worker. Failure to do so shall entail Procuring Entity taking up any measure to ensure the payment of wages including, but not limited to, withholding contractor's on-account bills.

e) In every case in which, by virtue of the provisions of the aforesaid Labour codes and the Rules, the Procuring Entity is obliged to pay any amount of wages to a workman employed by the contractor or his Sub-Contractor in execution of the contract or to incur any expenditure in providing welfare and health amenities required to be provided under the aforesaid Labour codes and the Rules or to incur any expenditure on account of the contingent liability of the Procuring Entity due to the contractor's failure to fulfill his statutory obligations under the aforesaid Labour codes and the Rules the Procuring Entity shall recover from the contractor, the amount of wages so paid or the amount of expenditure so incurred, and without prejudice to the rights of the Procuring Entity under the aforesaid Labour codes and the Rules, the Procuring Entity shall be at liberty to recover such amount or part thereof by deducting it from the security deposit and/ or from any sum due by the Procuring Entity to the contractor whether under the contract or otherwise. The Procuring Entity shall not be bound to contest any claim made against it under the aforesaid Labour codes and the Rules except on the contractor's written request, and upon giving the Procuring Entity complete security for all costs, for which the Procuring Entity might become liable in contesting such claim. The decision of the Procuring Entity regarding the amount recoverable from the contractor as stated above shall be final and binding on the contractor.

24.3. Occupational Safety, Health, Working Conditions, Social Security, and Industrial Relations Requirements:

As per Labour Codes, which included Code on Wages, 2019, The Industrial Relations Code 2020, Code on the Social Security 2020, and The Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions 2020 and rules thereunder, the following provisions shall be ensured by the contractor.

24.3.1. Provisions for Workers:

At his own expense, the contractor shall make adequate arrangements for the housing, supply of drinking water, and provision of clean sanitation, including urinals, etc., for his staff and workers, directly or through the petty contractors or sub-contractors.

The contractor shall also provide a temporary crèche (Bal-mandir) where 50 or more workers are employed at a time.

Suitable sites on Procuring Entity's land, if available, but without any obligation to do so, may be allotted to the contractor for the erection of labour camps, either free of charge or on such terms and conditions that the Procuring Entity may prescribe.

All camp sites shall be maintained in clean and sanitary conditions by the contractor at his own cost.

During the execution of services, unless otherwise stipulated in the contract, the contractor shall at his own cost provide the following materials as is necessary for:

(a) The safety, hygiene, satisfaction, elegance, acceptance, proper handling of assets and shall ensure that no damage, injury, or loss is caused or likely to be caused to any person or assets or hindrance to other works/ services.

(b) Environmental requirements to conserve energy, water, wood, paper, and other resources, reduce waste, phase out the use of ozone-depleting substances, and minimise the release of greenhouse gases, volatile organic compounds, and other substances damaging health and the environment.

24.3.2. Medical Facilities: the contractor shall provide medical facilities at the site as prescribed by the Contract Manager on the advice of the Procuring Entity's Medical Authority commensurate with the strength of the contractor's resident staff and workers. Such facilities shall include a First-Aid facility manned with staff trained in first aid as per labour codes or the Contract Manager's directions.

24.3.3. Medical Certificate of Fitness for Labour

The contractor shall not employ a person below 18 years of age. For delivery of Services under the contract, unless a medical certificate of fitness in the prescribed form under labour codes (or as directed by the contract manager) is granted to each worker by a certifying surgeon certifying that he is fit to work as an adult, is obtained and kept in the custody of the contractor or a person nominated by him in this behalf and the person carries with him, while at work, a token giving a reference to such certificate.

(i) Period of Validity of Medical Fitness Certificate: A certificate of fitness granted or renewed for the above

said purposes shall be valid only for one year at a time. The certifying surgeon shall revoke a certificate granted or renewed if, in his opinion, the holder of it is no longer fit for work in the capacity stated therein.

Where a certifying surgeon refuses to grant or renew a certificate or revoke a certificate, he shall, if so required by the person concerned, state his reasons in writing for doing so.

(ii) Medical Re-Examination of Labour: Where any official appointed on this behalf by the Ministry of Labour believes that any person employed in connection with the execution of any work under this Contract in the age group 18 to 65 years is without a certificate of fitness or is having a certificate of fitness but no longer fit to work in the capacity stated in the certificate, he may serve on the contractor, or the person nominated by him in this regard, a notice requiring that a certifying surgeon and such person shall examine such persons shall not if the concerned official so directs, be employed or permitted to do any work under this Contract unless he has been medically examined and certified that he has been granted a certificate of fitness or a fresh certificate of fitness, as the case may be.

25. Governing Laws and Jurisdiction

25.1 Governing Laws and Jurisdiction

This Contract, its meaning and interpretation, and the relation between the Parties shall be governed by the Laws of India for the time being in force.

Irrespective of the place of delivery, or the place of performance or the place of payments under the contract, the contract shall be deemed to have been made at the place from which the Letter of Award (LoA or the contract Agreement, in the absence of LoA) has been issued. The courts of such a place shall alone have jurisdiction to decide any dispute arising out or in respect of the contract.

25.2 Changes in Laws and Regulations

Unless otherwise stipulated in the contract, if after the last deadline for the bid submission (Technical), any law, regulation, ordinance, order or bye-law having the force of law is enacted, promulgated, abrogated, or changed in India (which shall be deemed to include any change in interpretation or application by the competent authorities) that subsequently affects the Delivery Date and/ or the contract Price, then such Delivery Date and/ or Contract Price shall be correspondingly increased or decreased, to the extent that the contractor has thereby been affected in the performance of any of its obligations under the contract. Notwithstanding the foregoing, such additional or reduced cost shall not be separately paid or credited if the same has already been accounted for in the price adjustment provisions where applicable.

26. NOTE: In addition to above conditions, the other terms & conditions shall be applicable as per enclosed General conditions of contract & scope of work other terms and condition of contract under this tender document.
